The History of Quebec and Canada program will enable the student to comprehend the primary political, social, economic, cultural, and religious factors that have shaped Québec within the Canadian context. In addition, through various analytic activities, students will develop and practice critical thinking skills that will assist them in discovering how their national history is still living and breathing around them.

Student Expectations

- All materials **MUST** be brought to class (binder, workbook etc.)
- Homework **MUST** be completed. It will be checked regularly.
- Students are responsible for taking notes and keeping handouts organized in their binders. Marks will be awarded for the neatness and completeness of binders.

Late Penalties

- Homework and assignments will be assigned on a regular basis.
- **Absent for Homework:** If a student is absent due to illness on the day homework is due, it must be handed in on the first day the student is back in school. If a student will be absent due to a planned activity (non-illness), he is required to inform the teacher at least 48 hours in advance in order to schedule the due date for the work that he will miss.
- **Absent for Tests:** If a student is absent for a test due to illness, he is required to write the test on the **first day** back in school. If a student will be absent for a test due to an activity (planned absence), he must inform the teacher at least 48 hours in advance in order to schedule a time to write the test.
- Late penalties: 10% will be deducted per school day (even if we do not have history scheduled) up to a maximum of two days. On the third day, a grade of zero will be assigned.
- Assignments must be submitted to the teacher. Assignments cannot be submitted via e-mail.
