Course Objectives

- To expose students to a variety of scripts and plays;
- To introduce students to stage movement;
- To develop voice, poise and confidence;
- To introduce students to stage terminology;
- To develop script-writing skills

Course Content

- **Basic, Intermediate and Advanced Stage Movement:** Students will do everything from standing still to stage combat;
- **Voice:** Students will do breathing exercises and work toward developing clear, well-projected voices;
- **Improvisation:** Students will practice the art of improvisation in pairs and small groups;
- **Terminology:** Students will learn and use proper stage terminology;
- **Script-writing:** Students will work individually and in pairs to craft their own characters, situations and conflicts.

Homework and Assignments Policy

Rules of the Class

- Absolutely no rough-housing is permitted. Students who are hitting/shoving, throwing objects, running or engaging in any activity which is inappropriate for the Maclean Centre will be immediately evicted from class.
- Students must be visible to the teacher at all times. This means you must stay in front of the curtains.
- Absolutely no food or drinks will be allowed in the Maclean Centre – this includes water.
- The Maclean Centre is used for many activities and sometimes the stage has objects that do not belong to us on or around it. These objects are always off limits to students.
- Students must use the stairs to access the stage. **Do not jump off the stage.**

Period Four

Every period four will be conducted in Room 235. Each student will do a special presentation on an assigned date.

The student should be prepared with anything he needs for his presentation (eg. iPad, dongle, etc.).
