- For any student wishing to improve basic Math skills over the summer months, our Summer School is an option. However, for those wanting to do some work at home, the following book is recommended:
 - Decimals Mathematics (Workbooks A and B) Grade 6 --> ISBN 978-2-7613-6136-1

For those parents who would like other resources, the following list provides more topics students can improve with during the summer months:

- Mental Math skills -- addition, subtraction, multiplication, subtraction -- 15 by 15 grid
- Multiplication and Division of 3 and 4 digit numbers
- Fractions -- addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, common denominator, mixed fractions, improper fractions
- Decimals -- addition, subtraction, multiplication, division
- Estimation
- Time Calculations --- hours/minutes/seconds
- Basic Geometric Shapes -- triangles, squares, rectangles
- Perimeter and Area of basic shapes

- **Report Card:** A copy of your son's final Grade 6 Report Card *must* be sent to the Admissions office on or before August 29, 2017.
- **Student Health Form:** The Student Health Form was sent with your Acceptance Package. This form must be completed and returned to the school **on or before August 29, 2017**. If it is not, your son must bring in a written note by **September 1, 2017** addressed to Mrs. Supino, indicating the date of the Doctor's appointment. Failure to do so will result in your son being ineligible to participate in Loyola activities i.e., extra-curricular activities, Physical Education.

SUMMER SCHOOL ACADEMIC WORKSHOPS AND SPORTS SKILLS CLINICS

As part of our July Summer School program, we are offering three Academic Workshops and two Sports Skills Clinics. Study Skills, which will complement the skills taught in Secondary 1, will satisfy Mom and Dad, followed by one of the two Sports Skills Clinics for the young athlete.

WORKSHOPS: THE FOLLOWING COURSES ARE HIGHLY RECOMMENDED FOR INCOMING STUDENTS.

1. Basic Writing and Reading Skills

- This course is designed to help incoming Secondary 1 students and next year's Secondary 2 and 3 students who have had difficulty with basic English grammar or reading comprehension in English. It is also ideal for students who attended a French Immersion Program or French school and, therefore, have had limited exposure to English grammar or reading in English.

It is hoped that this 17-session course will provide students with basic grammar mechanics and sentence skills that will better prepare them to meet the challenge of expressing themselves by means of the written word.

- The cost of the course is \$230, plus a \$30 registration fee (payable once per student). Classes meet each morning for 90 minutes. It is a four-week session running from Tuesday, June 27th through Wednesday, July 19th.

2. Basic Mathematical Skills

This course is designed to help incoming Secondary 1 students who have difficulty with basic Math. It is hoped that this 17-session course will bring students' Math competencies up to a level that will give them a greater chance at success in Secondary 1. The course will focus on basic computation, fractions, mental math, and properties of number systems.

The cost of the course is \$230, plus a \$30 registration fee (payable once per student). Classes meet each morning for 90 minutes. It is a four-week session running from Tuesday, June 27th through Wednesday, July 19th.

3. Study Skills

- For Secondary 1, 2 & 3 students who need to improve study habits and effectiveness, we are offering **two Study Skills Workshops**. The course will focus on developing the following: note-taking methods, getting information from textbooks, test-taking, problem-solving skills and how to study and use time more effectively.
- The cost of this course is \$130 (including text), plus a \$30 registration fee (payable once per student). Classes meet each morning for 90 minutes. You may choose between one of the two 2-week sessions offered; **Tuesday, June 27th through Friday, July 7th** or **Monday, July 10th through Thursday, July 20th**.

SPORTS SKILLS CLINICS

1. **Basketball, Football**

- Loyola High School has very well respected Basketball and Football programs, having won City Championships at the Bantam, Midget and Juvenile levels. This summer the coaching staff will be offering 9-day intensive skills clinics in conjunction with the Loyola Summer School. These courses are **not** designed for the elite basketball or football player.
- These skills courses concentrate on the basics of each game. The student/teacher ratio will not exceed 15 to 1. Individual attention is guaranteed. The aims of the clinics are to enhance your son's appreciation of basketball and football and to provide him with the necessary skills to improve his performance and his understanding of the game. If he is interested in trying out for one of our school teams, these clinics may be of interest to him.

2. **Course Information:**

- The basketball and football clinics will be offered in two sessions:
 - **Tuesday, June 27th through Friday, July 7th**
 - **Monday, July 10th through Thursday, July 20th**
- The cost of each 2-week clinic is \$130, plus \$30 registration fee (payable once per student).
- The courses run daily for 90 minutes.

- **To pre-register by mail:** You must print the Registration Form below and send it to the attention of Mr. Burke, together with FULL PAYMENT. You will be contacted and advised of the time of the course(s) on June 26th, Registration Day.

- In order that the students may get the most out of these 7th courses, we will limit class size. Therefore we respectfully suggest that, if interested, you respond promptly. If classes are full, priority will be given to Loyola students and Loyola affiliated students.

DRESS AND GROOMING CODE

Dress Code is one of the traditions that has always distinguished Loyola. We feel that dress is important and has an influence on the welfare of the school and the people who make it up. Loyola insists that students comply with both the specifics and the spirit of its dress code. We count on the support of our parents in ensuring that the dress code is respected at all times.

I. DRESS CODE: SPECIFICS (WHAT MAY OR MAY NOT BE WORN)

Loyola students, unlike those from other private schools, are not required to wear a school uniform. They must, however, conform to a dress code that has been designed to permit them to express their individuality and personal style. The dress code is not optional. By agreeing to send their sons to Loyola, parents are signifying their acceptance of this code and their willingness to assist the school in enforcing its stipulations.

The Loyola Dress Code specifies that only certain types and styles of clothes may be worn in and around the school, travelling to and from school, and in other school situations. Within limits, however, it still leaves plenty of room for variations and choice depending on individual taste. ***In all cases of dispute or interpretation concerning what may or may not be worn, the Vice-Principal of Discipline is the final arbiter.*** Our aim is to ensure that our students present a positive image of themselves and our school. Students who do not comply with these regulations will be subject to disciplinary action.

1. IN SCHOOL AND ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

In school and on school grounds, throughout the school day, students are required to wear the following apparel:

- a) Suit coat, dress jacket or blazer
- b) *Dress shirts must be tucked into dress pants with buttons all the way up the front, (this includes the top button)*
- c) Proper tie knotted and worn at the collar at all times
- d) **BLACK OR DARK BROWN CLASSIC FOOTWEAR ONLY** (no exceptions will be made)
- e) Classic cut dress pants (**NO COTTON PANTS**)
- f) A solid-coloured, lightweight dress turtleneck, tucked inside the dress pants, may be worn.
- g) *Heavy gauge sweater-type turtlenecks are NOT permitted.*
- h) Underneath a blazer, a v-neck sweater may accompany a shirt and tie, and a round crew neck sweater may accompany a turtleneck.
- i) A belt must be worn.
- j) White socks and ankle socks are not permitted.
- k) **THE FULL DRESS CODE IS IN EFFECT WHILE IN THE SCHOOL.** At all other times, the dress code for travelling to and from school (see below) is in effect. Exceptions are noted in Section 6 - Special Situations.
- l) Winter footwear may NOT be worn in classrooms and corridors.

2. TRAVELLING TO AND FROM SCHOOL

- a) Dress pants and a dress shirt must be worn at all times.
- b) Unconventional outerwear is NOT permitted.
- c) Any student who jogs or bicycles to school on a regular basis as part of a physical fitness or training program, should check with the office for special permission to dress appropriately. He is required, however, to arrive at the gym to shower and change into school dress.

3. AFTER-SCHOOL SPORTING ACTIVITIES

Students attending after-school sporting activities, both at Loyola and at other schools, must comply with the dress regulations for travelling to and from school.

4. GYM, EXTRA-CURRICULAR SPORTS, INTER-CLASS SPORTS AND PICK-UP GAMES

- a) Students must wear proper shorts and t-shirt for gym classes.
- b) Students who engage in pick-up games, at various times in and around the school, are urged to wear appropriate clothing. They must resume proper school dress before returning to class or leaving for home.

5. SATURDAYS AND HOLIDAYS

Students coming to school (or gym or the rink) on Saturdays and holidays may dress as they wish or as is appropriate; provided that what they wear is neat and clean and avoids extremes.

6. SPECIAL SITUATIONS

Students in school or on school grounds for special reasons or in special situations where normal dress clothes are inappropriate (e.g. doing work around the school, setting up for social activities, doing certain types of work for the sports tournament), may wear appropriate clothing if given permission by the supervising teacher. The Vice-Principal of Discipline should be informed.

7. SOCIAL ACTIVITIES, RETREATS, AND FIELD TRIPS

Dress regulations for social activities, retreats, and field trips will be specified at the time of these activities by the moderator.

8. SUMMER DRESS CODE

- Loyola Golf/Polo Shirt. No other golf shirt or polo shirt is permitted.
- Dress shirt (tie not required)
- Dress pants (not cotton – under any circumstances)
- Dress shoes.

All other directives must conform to regular dress regulations. The dates of Summer Dress are at the discretion of the Vice-Principal of Discipline.

II. DRESS CODE: SPIRIT (OVERALL APPEARANCE)

The rationale of the Loyola Dress Code is neatness and cleanliness and the avoidance of extremes and fads in clothes and grooming. It is not enough that the student comply with the specifics of the dress code. He must also respect its spirit and rationale in his overall appearance.

1. **Neatness and cleanliness:** Dirty, torn or shabby clothes, shoes, outerwear or footwear, are NOT permitted under any circumstances in school, on school grounds, travelling to and from school, at or after school sports activities, on Saturdays and holidays, at social events, retreats and field trips. When dress pants are worn, they must be regularly pressed.
2. **Hair:** Hair must be cut to a length that is off the collar, out of the eyes and be the student's natural colour. Hair products are NOT permitted. No outlandish haircuts are permitted. Students will have a maximum of 3 days to conform to the proper regulations. After the 3rd day, the student will receive an office jug every school day until his hair meets school regulations.
3. **Facial Hair:** Facial hair is NOT permitted. Students with facial hair will be required to shave immediately at the office and will receive an office jug.
4. **Fit:** Clothes must fit properly. Pants must be worn with a belt and shirts must be tucked neatly into dress pants.
5. **Colour coordination:** Colour coordination or contrasts in clothes that are unconventional, bizarre, outlandish, or intended to deviate from the norm, are NOT permitted.
6. **Jewelry:** Earrings, eyebrow rings, tongue rings, etc., are NOT permitted in school, on school grounds or at any other school-related activities. Rings, collars, wristbands and pendants must not be outlandish. Wallet chains must not be visible. Failure to comply with the above mentioned will result in immediate confiscation of the item and the student will receive an office jug.
7. **Suit coat, dress jacket or blazer:** Individual teachers may allow the removal of suit coat, dress jacket or blazer in class. This permission should never be presumed by the student. Students must wear the jacket when leaving the classroom.
8. **Hats:** Hats, including baseball caps, may NOT be worn in school.

NOTE: All teachers have been asked to assist in maintaining observance of the Loyola Dress Code in all situations. A dress code is more difficult to enforce than a uniform. We count on the good will of our students in order to preserve this privilege. Students who choose not to conform to the dress code are liable to discipline from all faculty. This may include teacher jug and/or office jug. Students who constantly choose to abuse the dress code will be reported to the Vice-Principle of Discipline. In all cases, students abusing the Dress and Grooming Code will be made to conform. Students who blatantly choose to defy the dress code will be sent home.



SUMMER DRESS CODE

Summer dress code is one of the traditions and privileges that have always distinguished Loyola. We feel that dress is important and has an influence on the welfare of the school and the people who make up the Loyola family.

The following constitutes acceptable Summer Dress attire:

- Loyola golf/polo shirt. **No other** golf shirt or polo shirt is permitted. Please note that Loyola polo shirts are available for purchase from our school store.
- Dress shirt (tie not required)
- Dress pants (not cotton – under any circumstances)
- Dress shoes

Hair must be cut to a length that is off the collar, out of the eyes (length of bangs, regardless of how it is combed, must not go below the eyes) and be the student's natural colour. In a nutshell – short, neat with avoidance of extremes or fads.

The start of Summer Dress is at the discretion of school Administration and only takes effect when officially announced by the VP of Discipline. Those in violation of the dress code and school grooming will lose the privilege of Summer Dress for the remainder of the school year.

As always we would like to thank parents for their continued support in ensuring that the dress code is respected at all times.
