Quebec Secondary School Graduation Requirements

A minimum of least 54 credits in Secondary IV and V (20 credits must be obtained in Secondary V).

In addition, the student must pass the following courses:

Secondary IV	Secondary V
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mathematics (Technical or Scientific) • Science and Technology or Applied Science and Technology • History and Citizenship Education • Secondary IV Arts Education (Fine Arts, Music, Drama or Dance) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Language of instruction (English) • Second language (French) • Ethics and Religious Culture (or equivalent) or Physical Education

Loyola Diploma Requirements

In addition to the Quebec High School Leaving Certificate, Loyola offers its own diploma.

Requirements:

- The student must maintain a minimum 65% average.
- The student must obtain a minimum of 60% in all subjects.
- The student may not carry more than one failed subject. The failed subject may not be Secondary 4 or Secondary 5 English or French.
- Further to the academic requirements, and equally as important, the student must demonstrate such virtues as honesty, trustworthiness, and moral worth.
- The student in Secondary 5 must complete successfully 24 hours of community service. (CSP)

5. Start the application process well in advance, certainly no later than the end of October.
