In the Grade 8 history course students will study the time period from the Late Middle Ages to the French Revolution and beyond. The study of history and cultural geography enables students to become aware of the impact of the past in shaping the present. In order to understand the present, students study the evolution of societies over time, in order to understand how some societies have developed into their present state.

- **English section:** *Time and Place (ERPI)*, no workbook for History

Late Penalties and Class Expectations

- Homework and assignments will be assigned on a regular basis.
- Late penalties: 10% will be deducted every day (even if there is no class scheduled). After three days, a grade of zero will be assigned.

- **Quizzes/Tests**: A student who knows that he will be absent for a test, **MUST INFORM HIS TEACHER AT LEAST 48 HOURS IN ADVANCE** in order to schedule a date and time to write the missed test. A student who is absent because of an illness or for unexpected reasons, is required to write the missed test **ON THE FIRST DAY BACK** in school following his absence, regardless if he has that class scheduled on that day. The student, upon his return, must see his teacher to determine the time and location of the test.

Cheating and Plagiarism

- Any attempt to represent as one's own work, the work of another, is an act of academic dishonesty that can incur both academic and disciplinary penalties.
